


Troop 9167 wanted to comfort them by giving them a baby blanket for when they take their baby home. We spent over 150 hours planning, purchasing fabric, sewing, and collecting blankets. We made 61 blankets and collected 30 more gently used blankets from friends and family members. We delivered the blankets to the St. Joseph's Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit on April 26, 2010 and got to see a baby in an incubator who will receive one of our blankets!

This project is dedicated to the memory of Cole Harrison, the brother of one of our former Girl Scout troop members. Cole was born July 7, 2008 with multiple medical complications and spent much of his life in the NICU and PICU. Cole passed away on February 17, 2010.

Project Title: Breezeway Renovation





The other two sets of signs were for the road runners and PE running track. Our troop met in the cafeteria at Cypress Grove for several years even after the girls were in high school and Karen wanted to do something for the school. One of her favorite

teachers is Sandy Lewellen and Karen talked with her about making signs for the tree that was being planted in memory of a student who had died suddenly. Karen used her cookie dough money to buy the supplies for the signs, and carved, painted and mounted the signs on posts. She got to meet the family during the dedication ceremony and they were very touched that she did this for their daughter. Karen had another favorite teacher, Coach Childers, at that school and was in the road runners club with him. The school constructed a new running track last summer and Karen wanted to make signs to show how far the track was. Karen mounted the signs on the front and back of the posts so the kids can see them running either direction. The signs were placed at opposite ends of the track so the kids can see them when they come out for PE and also neighborhood people can see them when they use the track. Karen really enjoyed making the signs and helping support the school and the memory of a student.

They met with and taught a younger Girl Scout troop about Scotty's House and the need for the blankets. The younger troop also helped tie some of blankets. Kristina and Sarah delivered the blankets to Scotty's House. Scotty's House has reported back to the girls about how much the blankets mean to these children who are going through a difficult time.

Description: I collected several thousand hygiene items and assembled 619 hygiene care kits for the homeless veterans residing in Central Texas. The hygiene care kits included a new pair of men's white crew socks, shampoo, conditioner, lotion, bars of soap, spiral memo pad, toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, two writing pens, sewing kit, cotton balls, q-tips, shaving razor, band-aids, safety pins, extra zip-locks, and two blank note cards. I personally wrote a thank-you note to each veteran thanking them for their service. The hygiene care kit contents were housed in a plastic school pencil box. All 619 hygiene care kits were transported to Austin, Texas on October 23, 2009 for the "Homeless Veterans Stand Down". I personally gave 175 care kits to homeless veterans that day and verbally thanked each veteran for their military service and for attending the Stand Down. The remaining 444 hygiene kits were divided between the homeless veteran coordinators of Austin, College Station, Temple, and Waco. The remaining kits will be distributed as future homeless veterans are identified and serviced through the four facilities.
