

Title Use of Stained Glass to Join Communities

Description



Dione's project was designing and installing two stained glass windows as well as educating the Church and School as to the symbolism shown in the glass. With the help of Brazos Glassworks, a local glass shop, she

designed two stained glass windows, which represent the Gospels of Matthew and Mark. She selected this project because she hoped to encourage pride in the School and Church communities. The project gives not only a sense of

unity between the students and parishioners but also more insight into the Catholic faith by educating both bodies on symbolism. Plaques describing the project provide a permanent means of educating students.

The purple and gold border pieces represent the school's colors. Additionally, the gold glass pieces located in each corner originally belonged to the upper level of St. Joseph Church before the addition of its current stained glass panels.

Description



Mikayla's project was to design and create stained glass panels that would serve to unite St. Joseph Church and School. She created two windows that symbolized two of the Gospel writers and held a dedication ceremony that informed the members of the Church and School of the meaning behind the windows. Her project helped educate and enrich the religious aspect of St. Joseph School. It helps the students recognize the importance of faith in their lives, and may even encourage them to do

something similar in the future. She selected this project because she wanted a lasting project that would truly help the St. Joseph community. She also wanted to learn the art of stained glass. The stained glass took weeks to make, and the

overall project took over a year. She believes the largest obstacle was the precision necessary to make the glass fit into the window. She overcame this by checking her measurements and mathematical conclusions repeatedly.



Description Maggie developed a program that made it easy for local Scouting/youth groups to become regular visitors to area nursing and assisted living facilities. For a period of 6 months, Maggie provided a monthly evening activity for the residents at the Bluebonnet House on Wellborn Rd in College Station. She was entirely responsible for the design, development, advertising and implementation of these events. Some of the events that Maggie really enjoyed putting together for the residents included a movie night, tea party, a gardening event, edible campfire sing a long, and an Easter egg hunt. She enlisted the help of some of her friends from her Girl Scout Troop for these events. Maggie wanted to make it easier for local youth groups to spend volunteer time providing programs for the local elderly. She developed a booklet containing 18 ready-made programs for others to utilize. This booklet contains the themes, flyers, supply list, web links, estimated cost and all info needed for another group to provide easily a program for a group of residents.
