

Description My gold award addressed the issue of elderly mental health. During the Covid 19 pandemic families and caregivers of seniors living in nursing homes lacked the strategies and resources to support their loved ones with feelings of isolation and loneliness. Prior to the pandemic these feelings were an issue but a visit from a family member or a caregiver, leaving their room for a meal or participating in an activity organized by the care facility helped alleviate some of these feelings and provided an outlet for human interaction. Families and caregivers need to be aware of the mental health issues many seniors face when living in a care facility. These families and caregivers need resources for support and strategies they may use to assist their loved one as they transition to the new living arrangement or as they develop feelings of loneliness.




